



We have several individuals offered to get them started in beginning lessons and some of us still here during the long hot summer can show them a few simple tunes. Both boys, one is 12, one is 10, should be interesting. They have some younger siblings that might be interested also when the time comes.....

Other things, our emcee, our Vice Prez, having issues, left to go back to the north pole early, I say north because anywhere there's snow it might as well be the north pole. Most of us our age are having health issues. I have some sort of arthritis, went to a rheumatologist that prescribed Predisone for a short period of time, will find out this week what the prognosis is. This summer Fred Lapcheska is going to start weekly jam sessions and workshops some where here in Yuma to keep things going. I like to make bake goodies for our get togethers, especially Banana Nut bread and Bread Pudding, so if you didn't get any, not my fault, it must have been eaten quickly.

We have a hot fiddler in our midst "Angela Schauer, does bluegrass ditty's and along with Hot Licks John on his Martin guitar (can't remember his last name) play Bill Monroe tunes, we have pretty good time at our sessions. I reckon Janet Shelby and Linda Everts will be entering the Twin Fiddle competition in Weiser this year, if everyone remembers, they placed pretty high at the event last year but also too first place at Ajo in February this year. But we all practice more a few more and win events at contest, not to forget Dorothy Barstad, one of our senior members placed in winners bracket at the Worthen Memorial this past January..

I don't want to write a book but in closing, I happened upon a lady my age that plays piano very well, she was bragging to me that she once played the piano at Carnegie Hall. She heard some of us playing our instruments and told me 'you people are not very good, you need practice'. I told her some of us are amateurs and some are excellent performers and you have never heard Old Time Fiddle tunes. She didn't know what I was saying or didn't understand.
