



Black Velvet Waltz

Black Velvet Waltz is known as a Canadian tune, and supposedly named after a brand of Canadian whiskey. It is sometimes known as the Whiskey Waltz. The composer is not definitively known, but the tune has been attributed to several people, including Winnipeg radio fiddler Andy DeJarlis, and to Canadian radio CKNX Barn Dance fiddler Ross Mann.

The tune entered Midwest U.S. fiddle repertoire probably from Canadian broadcasts, and older fiddlers from the region (e.g. Les Raber, Charlie Walden) are aware of its Canadian roots. Some fiddlers in Arizona call it the **Cowboy Waltz**. There is also another tune with the name Black Velvet. And there is at least one other Cowboy Waltz. **Source: Traditional Tune Archive https://tunearch.org**
